FROM THE DESK OF ARCHDEACON JOHN

Dear Friends in Christ,

The Diocese of Toronto as part of the <u>Casting the Net Visioning</u>, undertook several surveys with both laity and clergy. At the top of the list consistently was deepening our relationship with Jesus Christ. People wanted more discipleship resources!

Bishop Andrew has retained Rev. Canon Judy Paulsen to head up a new initiative called **Seasons of Spiritual Renewal**. Bishop Andrew stated, "My hope is that this will lead us to a deep and profound joy in the gospel of Jesus Christ and a sense of communities large and small feeling a part of a rekindling of the Anglican Church in the Diocese of Toronto." We are inviting every member of our parish to participate in some way in this season of spiritual renewal at a Diocesan or parish level or both.

Seasons of Spiritual Renewal On-Line Workshops

A series of workshops will be offered online. The workshops being offered from September to December have now been scheduled. You will see in the newsletter a separate poster with an outline of the interesting workshops you can participate in. As you'll see, most workshops are being offered in a 1 to 2 p.m. timeslot. This will enable lay people to participate during their lunch hour as many of us have other commitments in the evening.

Registration for the fall workshops will open on Aug. 27. If you register for a workshop, Carol and I would ask that you let us know and give us your feedback about the program but also what learning lessons we can bring to St. James'.


Carol and I would like to start an **Alpha Program**. Alpha is organized as a series of sessions over 10 weeks, including a day away (optional). Each session starts with a meal, followed by a talk and then a discussion in small groups. The talks aim to cover the basic beliefs of the Christian faith We are thinking of a start date in late fall or mid-January. It takes a lot of planning and training of volunteers to run Alpha. To make Alpha work, we need about 4 or 5 core volunteers to help us run the program. A key feature of Alpha is to invite a friend, colleague, or neighbour to come and see what the Christian faith is about! Carol will be bringing back her **Lectio series** in the new year. She did this program last year and many found it to be a refreshing start to their day.

Many of you will have seen the **new children's area** in the nave. At our workshops, there was a consensus that we needed to make our place of worship more welcoming for families with young people. Until such time as we can develop a Sunday School program, we have created a spot for children with a lot of resources for them. It is important to have an adult person available to be present in this space to answer parent's questions and be a watchful eye. If interested, please speak with Bill Manley.

Finally remember that there are programs such as the **Book Group (Monday)**, **Contemplative Prayer (Tuesday)**, **and Scripture Study (Wednesday)**. All are invited to join in these programs! Also, every Wednesday at 11:30 a.m. there is a mid-day Eucharist. It is for about ½ hour and we assemble in the chancel area. We encourage you to come to the Lord's Table and find some comfort.

CENTERING PRAYER AND MEDITATION TUESDAY AT 12 NOON in person in Choir Room



Centering Prayer is a receptive method of aliant paragre that prepares us to receive the gift of the experience of God's prenmene within us. This method of prayer is both a relationship with God and a discipline to hoster that relationship. Centering Prayer is not meant to replace other kinds of prayer. Rather, it adds depth to all prayer and facilitates the movement into a receptive grayer of reating in God. Centering Prayer emphaairs prayer as a personal relationship with God and as a movement beyond retaincockly with God and as a movement beyond conversation with Christ to communion with Christ.


Archdeacon John and his family have moved back into the Rectory. Many parishioners were able to attend the open house. If you missed it, there will be another chance later in the year.




Have you ever wondered about the books chosen by the Book Discussion Group?


