Ascension Day is one of the earliest Christian festivals dating back to the year 68 CE. In the New Testament, Jesus Christ met several times with his disciples during the 40 days after his resurrection to instruct them on how to carry out his teachings. On the 40th day he took them to the Mount of Olives, where they watched as he ascended to heaven.

Ascension Day marks the end of the Easter season and occurs ten days before Pentecost. The disciples were told not to gaze up into heaven to look for Jesus but rather we are to find his presence amongst ourselves as we continue to build up the kingdom of God here on earth.
